She currently serves as a Clinical Instructor at the Lebanese American University (LAU) and an attending physician at LAU Medical Center–Rizk Hospital.

Dr. Gemayel is also a consultant in pediatric hematology and oncology at Rafic Hariri University Hospital and the Central Military Hospital in Beirut, where she continues to provide expert care for children with complex hematologic and oncologic conditions.

Dr. Gemayel earned her Doctor of Medicine degree from the Lebanese University in 1990 and pursued her pediatric residency training at the Jules Vernes Medical University of Amiens in France, where she obtained her Diplôme

Inter-Universitaire en Pédiatrie. She further specialized in hematology, earning a Diplôme Universitaire d'Hématologie from Pierre et Marie Curie University (Paris VI) and a Diplôme Universitaire de Thérapie Cellulaire from Lariboisière University (Paris VII). Her international experience includes specialized training in blood transfusion at the Institut National de Transfusion Sanguine (INTS) in Paris, and a fellowship in pediatric hematology, immunology, and bone marrow transplantation at the renowned Robert Debré and Saint Louis Hospitals in Paris.

Dr. Gemayel completed an elective fellowship at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, USA, in 2002. An experience that strengthened her commitment to advancing pediatric cancer care. Upon returning to Lebanon, she became one of the early contributors to the field of pediatric hematology-oncology, holding consultant positions at several leading hospitals including Notre Dame, Abou Jaoudé, Saint Georges, and Saint Joseph Hospitals.

Throughout her career, Dr. Gemayel has also played an active role in medical education and institutional development. She was responsible for the Pediatric Hematology-Oncology Fellowship Program at the Lebanese University, served on the Hematologic Oncology Pediatric Committee at the Ministry of Health, and participated in the Lebanese University's Steering and Accreditation Committee.
