


Ramzi Nakhle, MD

Dr. Nakhle earned his M.D. from the LAU Gilbert and Rose-Marie Chagoury School of Medicine in 2016, followed by a four-year residency in Emergency Medicine, where he served as Chief Resident during his final year. He completed an advanced fellowship in Emergency Medicine Ultrasound at McGill University in Montreal, Canada.

He is a certified member of the Canadian Point-of-Care Ultrasound Society (CPOCUS), the Canadian Association of Emergency Physicians (CAEP), and holds the Licentiate of the Medical Council of Canada (LMCC).

His research interests include emergency preparedness, resuscitation, trauma management, and the application of POCUS in acute care settings.
