Her recent work includes "Perception of the Lebanese Adults about Vaccination: A Survey" published in *Vaccines* in March 2023, which explores vaccine perceptions in Lebanon. In July 2023, she co-authored "The global challenges of long COVID-19 in adults and children" in *Travel Medicine and Infectious Disease*, addressing the ongoing issues of COVID-19.
