PHYSIOLOGIC JAUNDICE:

Jaundice in newborns is a very common condition. Up to 60% of full-term babies develop jaundice during their first week of life. **Physiological jaundice** develops in most newborns by their second or third day of life and disappear after 10 days. Most of the case, jaundice goes away without treatment. **Feeding your baby** often can encourage pooping (bowel movements). This helps your baby rid their body of the excess bilirubin. Phototherapy is recommended in case of severe jaundice.

GENITAL CRISIS:

Genitals could look enlarged on babies of both sexes. On a baby girl you may notice some vaginal discharge. It's normal, it's caused by the mother's hormones. A baby boy's testicles may not have fully descended from his abdomen, normally they will descend on their own.





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
